### "27th Sunday in Ordinary Time"

**Entrance Antiphon:** "Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all." Cf. Est 4: 17

**Communion Antiphon**: "The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him." Lam 3: 25

Reflection for this Sunday: The readings for this Sunday offer profound insights into the sanctity of marriage, the central role of family, and the necessity of a childlike trust in God. In the Genesis account, God creates woman as a partner for man, showing that marriage is a divinely intended union of equals. This partnership is meant to be one of mutual respect and support, symbolized by the creation of woman from man's rib, and emphasizes that marriage is not merely a social contract but a sacred bond blessed by God. Jesus reinforces this in the Gospel by stating that what God has joined together, no one should separate, underlining the lifelong commitment of marriage. The readings also highlight the importance of family as the basic unit of society, where love, care, and faith are fostered. Jesus' tender love for children in the Gospel reveals the value God places on family and the duty to care for and guide children in a nurturing environment. Furthermore, Jesus teaches us that to enter the Kingdom of God, we must trust in God like children, with complete dependence on His love and care, free from worry or the need for approval from others. Together, these readings call us to live out unity, love, and trust in our marriages, families, and in our relationship with God, helping us grow in faith and build stronger, more loving communities.
