# "The Baptism of the Lord"

Entrance Antiphon: "After the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Cf. Mt 3:16-17

**Communion Antiphon:** "Behold the One of whom John said: I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God." Jn 1: 32, 34

Reflection for this Sunday: The feast of the Baptism of the Lord invites us to reflect deeply on a transformative moment in Jesus' life, one that reveals His humility, mission, and the profound mystery of the Trinity. Though sinless, Jesus chose to be baptized by John the Baptist, aligning Himself with humanity in its weakness and need for redemption. This act of humility demonstrates His solidarity with us, showing that He came not to stand apart from us but to share fully in our struggles. His baptism marks the beginning of His public ministry, a moment when the heavens opened, the Holy Spirit descended like a dove, and the Father's voice proclaimed, "You are my beloved Son; with you, I am well pleased." This Trinitarian revelation highlights the unity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, a community of love inviting us into divine communion. For us, Jesus' baptism serves as a reminder of our own baptism, a sacrament that cleanses us of sin, incorporates us into God's family, and commissions us to continue His mission of love and service in the world. Baptism is not merely a past event but a call to a lifelong journey of discipleship, empowering us through the Holy Spirit to bear witness to God's goodness, care for the suffering, bring hope to the brokenhearted, and proclaim the Gospel through our lives. Just as Jesus' baptism prepared Him to bring healing and salvation to the world, our baptism calls us to embrace lives of humility, love, and mission, reflecting the divine love of the Trinity and inviting others into this life of grace. May we, like Jesus, live as beloved children of God, renewed in our baptismal promises, and inspired to share His light and love with everyone we meet.
