# "Third Sunday of Lent"

Entrance Antiphon: "My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor." Cf. Ps 25 (24): 15-16

**Communion Antiphon:** "The sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for her young: by your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. Blessed are they who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise." Cf. Ps 84 (83): 4-5

Reflection for this Sunday: The 3rd Sunday of Lent presents powerful themes of God's call to free us, the importance of staying faithful, and the need to bear fruit in our lives. The first reading reminds us of God's promise to deliver the Israelites from slavery in Egypt, showing that He is always aware of our struggles and works to free us from sin. Just as He heard the cries of His people, He hears us and calls us to trust in His plan. The second reading warns against idolatry, urging us to remain faithful and avoid anything that distracts us from God. Paul's message reminds us to learn from the past and ensure that nothing-whether wealth, power, or personal desires—takes precedence over our relationship with God. Finally, the Gospel parable of the barren fig tree highlights God's patience, giving us time to repent and bear good fruit. However, this patience is not endless; we are called to respond by living out our faith through good works. holding small-group discussions on Altogether, these readings emphasize God's desire to the book. If you have questions about starting a small free us, keep us on the right path, and see us flourish spiritually. By embracing these lessons, we deepen our faith and strengthen our relationship with Him. May we trust in His guidance, remain steadfast in our commitment, and bear the fruits of a faithful life. Amen.
