All Souls’ Day

Entrance Antiphon: “Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation!” Cf. Ps 38 (37): 22-23

Communion Antiphon: “You will show me the path of life, the fullness of joy in your presence, O Lord.” Cf. Ps 16 (15): 11

Reflection for this Sunday: All Souls’ Day is a deeply meaningful celebration in the life of the Church, a day when we lovingly remember and pray for all who have died, especially the souls in Purgatory who are being purified on their journey to Heaven. The Church teaches that our prayers, sacrifices, and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass can aid these souls, helping them draw nearer to the eternal light of God’s presence. On this day, Catholics throughout the world attend Mass, visit cemeteries, and offer prayers for deceased family members, friends, and even those who have no one to pray for them. It is a profound act of love and mercy—a spiritual work that bridges earth and heaven. All Souls’ Day also reminds us that death is not the end, but a passage toward the fullness of life with God. United in the Communion of Saints, we remain connected with those who have gone before us, confident that our prayers and acts of charity can assist them on their journey home. Together with All Saints’ Day, this feast strengthens our hope in the resurrection and God’s promise of eternal life. As we remember our departed loved ones, we do so with hearts filled with gratitude, faith, and trust in the tender mercy of our loving God.

Serving Those Who Serve Collection for the Archdiocese for Military Services, USA : This weekend, November 1 and 2, our parish will take up the “**Serving Those Who Serve**” Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS). 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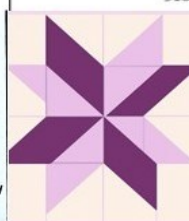
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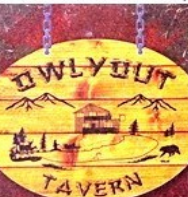
